MeitY has issued amendment to Administrative Approval vide no. 1(2)2012-HRD(Vol.III) dated 27.09.2019 based on PRSG recommendations made in its 7th meeting held on 25-April-2019 comprising the following approvals:

- Revised budget outlay of Rs. 287.00 Crore (GIA of Rs. 259.67 Crore) as against the approved outlay of Rs. 366.78 Crore (GIA 325.98 Crore) as per Annexure-I of Annexure-VI. Continuation of project for setting up of 12 NIELIT campuses at Kokrajhar, Imphal, Senapati, Dibrugarh, Jorhat, Tezpur, Pasighat, Lunglei, Chuchuyimlang, Churachandpur, Gangtok and Alzawal. The centre-wise Approved/Revised budget outlay as per Annexure-II of Annexure-VI.
- To drop setting up of permanent NIELIT Campuses at six locations viz. Guwahati, Shillong, Silchar, Tezu, Tura and Itanagar due to non-availability of land related issues.
- Extension of the project duration for a period of one year (till 31.03.2020).
- PRSG vide in its 7th meeting has already recommended below mentioned timelines for utilizing the Recurring Expenditure (RE) regarding 12 centers to be pursued superseding the its earlier decision conveyed vide OM referred as Annexure-III.

All other OMs and instructions thereon related to NECB Project would remain applicable and valid.

4. PRSG has directed to take necessary precautions towards collection of updated data from the individual centers at regular intervals. Accordingly, Centres to be more diligent to ensure consistency and accuracy of the data while furnishing the information/ data to various authorities.



- 5. In pursuance of recommendations of PRSG regarding successful closure of 12 sites, all the activities as required under the terms and conditions of the project including the following activities are to be completed in a time bound manner:
 - Equipment: Procurement of Equipment as per DoP/SoP prescribed in OM dated 04.04.2019(Annexure IV).

ii. Construction:

- a. Sounding the PMCs to complete the construction work with in the stipulated time.
- b. Ensuring timely release of payments against RA Bills as per OM MIS(11)2017-NIELIT(CIVIL)/01/7291 dated 29.11.2018.
- c. To ensure levy of Liquidated Damages Charges (if any) as per agreement and settle on or before final payment to PMC.
- d. To ensure validity of Bank guarantee(s) as per term and condition of contract.
- e. To ensure return of interest if earned by PMC or if no interest has been earned by PMC, ask to submit an undertaking mentioning that no interest has been earned by PMC on advance(s) before release of final payment.
- f. Other activities needed for successful completion and closure of project.
- iii. Accounts: Centers are to work out the head wise requirements of funds based upon the amended budget provisions by adjusting the already released funds in respect of all expenditure. Centers would ensure the adherence of amended Head wise budget Outlay provision under expenditure heads viz Civil and utilities, Equipment's and Recurring (GIA + IR) as indicated in Table-1 & 2.
- 6. For dropping of construction activities at 6 sites as mentioned in para 1, the related activities are to be initiated and completed by the concerned centres at the earliest including following:
 - i. Submit the closure report as per prescribed format attached as Annexure-VI
 - Audited Receipt and Expenditure Statement upto 31-03-2019.
 - Informing PMC about the decision, discontinuation of already signed agreement as per terms & conditions.
 - iv. Refund of advance, if any given to PMC.
 - To ensure return of interest if earned by PMC or if no interest has been earned by PMC, ask to submit an undertaking mentioning that no interest has been earned by PMC on advance(s)
 - Refund of unutilized/ unspent balance of GIA with centre as on 31st March, 2019 along with interest earned beyond revised budgetary outlay provisions.
 - All formalities may be completed within one month and compliance report along with refunds to NIELIT HQ may be completed/submitted/remitted by 01.11.2019.

7. PRSG in its 7th meeting has also recommended that NIELIT Centres may keep offering training programmes from temporary premises with all support from own/NIELIT Hqr resources w.e.f. 01-04-2019. The required recurring and other expenditure support etc. would be met out by NIELIT for six centres w.e.f. 01.04.2019 and onward from its own resources.

Accordingly, these six Centres are advised to examine the sustainability aspects of continuing the NIELIT operations viz available resources, resources required, ongoing liabilities, revenue streams, existing agreements, work in hand and targeted works, ongoing trainings and potentials of new trainings etc. We may also request that a comprehensive report on sustainability aspects including with appropriate recommendations, action plan, way outs of sustenance etc. be submitted by 01.11.2019.

As per amendment to Administrative Approval No. 1(2)/2012-HRD dated 30.05.2012 issued vide. No. L-140 11/34/2014-HRD dated 10.06.2015 project entitled as "Development of North East Region by Enhancing Training/Education cap trity in the IECT area", the budget outlay was revised to Rs. 256.78 crore by Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeirY), Govt. of India. The provision contains GIA of Rs. 325.98 erore from MeltY and Rs. 40.80 erore has to be met out of Internal Revenue(IR). Gene a fon as per details given below.

The above estimated outlay comprises two source of funding (GIA from MeltY as well as IR from MIELIT Centres). Allocations in respect of Capital, Equipment and Recurring expenses head is needed to be categorically bifurcated in respect of source of funding. After deliberation, it has been decided that IR shall be apportioned in all three expenditure heads (Capital, Equipment and Recurring) in a way to makeover the total budget outlay provision in respective heads amounting Rs 201.79 Cr., Rs 62.01Cr. and Ro 102.98 Cr. respectively.

Accordingly, in consonance with budget outlays mentioned in Administrative Approval, the bifurcation of source of funding i.e. GIA and IR for expenditure heads (viz. capital, equipment, recurring) is

given overleaf for strict compliance.

As per existing norms vide Diffice Memorandum as referred above, 60% at the amount of the RE bills raised by PMCs is being released by the centre after approval from NIELIT HQ within 7 days by the concerned Centre. Afterward balance 40% of RE Bills were released based on recommendations of Uniform Building Committee (UBC).

- 2. It has been observed that in the process of release of 60% payment of RE bills within 7 days, there is not much scope of any value addition as well as checks and balances at the level of HQ. At the time of release of balance 40 % of payments, the bills are diligently examined before release of payment. Therefore, in case there is any shortcoming or deviation at the stage of release of 60 % payment observed afterward, the same is adjusted at the subsequent stage. Also the Centre Heads have been already duly empowered to consider the RE Bill and recommend for release of payments by disbanding the mechanism of Uniform Building Committee(s) vide 0M mentioned above (Ref.-1).
- 3. Accordingly, it has been decided that for release of 60% of RE bills, CI has been empowered to give concurrence. As per new procedure, Centre Heads shall recommend 100 % payment of RE Bills after duly examining and forward to CI without referring HQ. CI may concur in and convey it to concerned Centre Head for release of payment after duly satisfying himself/herself. For facilitating the CI for taking appropriate decision/concurrence for release, BIC must verify/satisfy himself/herself about the correctness of RA bills and furnish the relevant information/certificates as per format attached as Annexure-III. For filling up the information in the format in Annexure III, the under-mentioned instruction may be followed:
 - I. The filling up and verification up to S.No. 5 of format shall be done by concerned ED/ Director/DIC.

- 4. After release of 60 % as concurred by Cl, the recommendations of CI for 100 % payment (ratification of 60 % payment already made to PMC and release of balance 40 % payment) are to be sent to NIELIT HQ as per part D of format. Payment matters shall be processed at HQ in a batch on monthly basis to enhance efficiency. The recommendations may be processed by Project Section with Finance and Admin wing concurrently. CI and concerned DIC will join through Video Conference for clarification then & there.
- The above process are issued towards indicating clear cut duties and responsibilities for ensuring efficiency and transparency. All stakeholder of the process shall ensure due diligence. Violation thereof if any, may invite disciplinary/administrative action.

Utilization of GIA for NECB project, process of Construction Payment has already been laid down vide OM no. MIS(11)2017-NIBLIT(Civil)/01/7291 dated: 29.11.2018.

- Regarding recurring expenditure, the 100 % advance based on anticipated requirements upto March 2019 has been released excluding a few where recurring expenditure are nearing or exceeded the ceiling. Afterward head wise ceilings have been worked out for every individual Centre based upon OM NER(68)2017-NIELIT(Civil)/01-Vol-V/7292 dated 29.11.2018 as well as inputs from Centres.
- Centres are also asking for release of funds for procurement of equipments as some centres are nearing Completion of construction.
- 3. PRSG vide its 6th meeting held on 24.08.2018 has recommended the following:
 - After completion of construction of a centre/extension centre under the project
 the capital GIA needs to be stopped and recurring expenditure has to be met out
 from centre's own resources (subject to utilization of recurring head for a
 maximum period of five years from the year the centre actually started utilizing
 the same).
 - NIELIT Hqr may initiate action regarding inauguration, completion etc of NIELIT Centers/ extension Centres.
- In compliance of above recommendations of PRSG the following actions are required:
 - i. For calculating the timelines of five years for stopping the funds under RE head, financial year of start of first training/release of funds to the centre by HQ has been considered as start time of the five year duration. Accordingly, statement showing status of Centres. In respect of five year duration of RE support from GIA is as per Amoexure-I. The RE support to Lunglei and Chuchuyimlang centers has already exceeded to 6th year. Amount Rs. 72 lakh and Rs. 50 lakh were released to these two centres in their 6th year respectively. Actual recurring



expenditure by these two centres in their 6th year by utilizing the 6th year RE release is to be worked out in accordance with PRSG recommendation actual recurring expenditure in 6th year by these three centres is to be recouped from internal Generation (IR) by Centre and the same is also adjusted in the next release by HQ.

- tf. The centers whose construction activities are nearing completion are required to be equipped with lab and other infrastructure to ensure its operations as quickly as possible. Accordingly, the centers whose construction status has reached 80% and above, funds to the extent of balance ceilings in GIA under equipment head would be considered for release subject to availability of funds/ GIA. For procurement of listed equipment as per DPR, centre have to follow:
 - a. Rules, regulations and all codal formalities as enshrined in GFR and other procurement manuals/ guidelines/norms/ financial limit issued by competent Government time to time.
 - b. Delegation of Powers of NIELIT.
 - c. Ascertaining that Released funds to Centre for the purpose are to be utilized by or before the due date of submission of Utilization Certificate for these funds.



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

The 7th PRSG meeting of the above project was held under the chairmanship of Dr. Jaideep Kumar Mishra, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India, on 25th April, 2019 at NIELIT Centre Imphal) The list of participants is at Annexure-I. At the outset, Chairman welcomed the PRSG members and other participants and after brief round of introduction, he requested to initiate the discussions/presentation.

- Sh. A.K. Pipal, Director, Meity, requested Chief Investigator [CI] of the project, Shri L. Lanuwabang, Director-in-Charge, NIELIT Centre Kohima, to make presentation.
- Cl mentioned that the objective of the project is up-gradation of six NIELIT centres, two NIELIT Extension Centres and also to set up ten new NIELIT Extension Centres across NE Region and also to upgrade the training capacity of the Centres from 3080 candidates to 14400 candidates from the end of 5th year onwards.
- CI mentioned that all 18 Centres are operational from permanent/rented premises and offering 36 different courses in EICT domain. As of now the annual training capacity of all the above 18 centres in NE region is around 20,000 students. A list of courses run by these 18 Centres and candidates trained is given at Annexure -H and H(a).
- CI presented the following before the PRSG as under:
 - The total Revised Cost Estimate(RCE) of the project is Rs.366.76 Cr. out of which Rs.325.98 Cr. is Grant-in-Aid (GIA) from MeitY and Rs. 40,80 Cr. is Internal Revenue (IR) to be generated by NiELFF. Till date all the releases made to NIELIT by MeitY is Rs. 217.70 Cr.; and NIELIT has refunded an amount of Rs. 28,89 Cr including interest (CFI deposited). Honce, the actual amount available with NIELIT was Rs. 188.81 Cr. and out of which an expenditure of Rs.166.80 Cr. has been made as on 31.3.2019. The balance amount of Rs. 22.01 Cr is available with NIELIT and Rs. 27.38 Cr. has been generated as IR by NIELIT as on 31.03.2019. The details is at Annexure-III.
- He mentioned that presently construction is undergoing/at final stages at 12 locations/ Centres. The total approved budget outlay of these 12 Centres viz. Pasighat, Dibrugarh, Jorhat, Kokrajhar, Tezpur, Imphal, Churachandpur, Senapati, Aizawi, Lunglei, Chuchuyimlang and Gangtok is Rs. 216.25 Cr. and Rs. 138.97 Cr has been spent till 31.3.2019. The above 12 Centres have earned

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an IR of Rs. 20.21 Cr. as on 31.03,2019 [The SC/ST fee relimbursement upto the Financial Year 2016-17 has been taken into consideration).

- [iii] He stated that the construction work is not triking place at it locations/ Centres due to various reasons like non availability of land/ not suitable land provided by state gowt, etc. The total approved outlay of these six Centres viz. Iranagar, Tezu, Guwahati, Silchar, Shillong and Tura is Rs.148.03 Cr. Se far Rs. 26.06 Cr. has been spent for these Centre sunder the project. The above six Centres have earned an IR of Rs. 7.13 Cr. till 31.03.2019 [The SC/ST Fee reimbursement upto the Financial Year 2016-17 has been taken into consideration).
- (iv) He also indicated that at present construction of compuses at 12 locations is at various stages towards completion of the campuses.
- (v) The fund requirement for successful completion of these 12 Centres is Rs 104.79 Cr. The break-up of the fund requirement could be seen at the Annexure-III [additional fund required towards civil and utility is given at Annexure-IV] and may be considered by Meiry for release to NICLIT for setting up of 12 NIELIT Campuses in NE region.
- He highlighted as per the recommendation of NIELIT, Management Board a Committee of NIELIT should visit the under construction Centres to explore the sustainability of Centres under the project and present to the FRSG. The categorized details of the Centres locations and sustainability is given as under:
 - Centre locations with high development and high sustainability are Dibrugarh. Jorhat, Kokrajhar, Tezpur, Imphal, Churschandpur, Senapati and Aizawi.
 - (ii) Centre locations with high development and low sustainability are Pasighat, Lunglei, Chuchuyimlang and Gangtok.
 - (iii) Centre locations with low development and high sustainability are Guwahati, Silchar and Shillong.
 - (iv) Centre locations with low development and low sustainability are Itanagar, Tezu and Tura.

7. Further, CI presented the location-wise status of the physical and financial status of the project at 18 locations/ Centres. The details of the same is given at Annexure-V. He presented the status of six Centres viz. Guwahati, Shillong, Tura, Tezu, Silchar, and Itanagar and indicated that inspite of various efforts made by MeitY and NELIT the land has not been available at Itanagar Centre by the state Govt, so far, therefore the construction of NIELIT Campus at Itanagar could not be started. Also land is not yet in physical possession for Centres at Tezu(Arunachal Pradesh), Silehar(Assam), Shillong and Tura(Meghalaya) therefore, at these locations construction activities have not started. He further mentioned that land is in possession at three location viz. Guwahati [Assam] , Shillong and Tura[Meghalaya] . The land allotted is not found suitable for setting up of Guwahati Centre and NIELIT is yet to get a suitable land from the State Government.

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- He inform that at Shillong (Meghalaya), the land is in possession and construction work has not been in progress due to local land clearance issues. The PMC has totally stopped the construction work as the contractor is not willing to take up the construction of the campus. PMC has informed the same to NIELIT and Committee constituted by the NIELIT has suggested to drop the campus construction from the instant project.
- 7.2 At Tura (Meghalaya), land is in possession (0.5 acre) but the tender cost has been received very high even after re-tendering for the second time also. Further, PWD and CPWD in the state contacted for quotations/estimates of construction works but there is no significant progress. The NIELIT committee has suggested to drop the compus construction at Tura from the instant project, PRSG also took note of the same,
- 7.3 He also stated that at Itanagar (Arunachal Pradesh), despite of various efforts made by MeitY and NIELIT, the land has not been made available at Itanagar by the State Govt., therefore construction of NIELIT Campus at Itanagar has not been taken place.
- It was informed that the land at Silchar [Assam] is in physical possession but the land site is in low lying areas hence, required a large amount of earth filing; therefore, NIELIT is seeking a suitable land from Government of Assam. Hence immediate construction activities at Silchar is also ruled out.
- 7.5 At Guwahati land is in possession (3.3 acre) at amchang wild life sanctuary, sonapur. After a long follow up tree cutting permission was granted by State Administration. After-ward there was requirement of earth cutting permission and no earth cutting permission was granted by the State Administration. Hence, Construction could not started due to non receipt of Environmental Clearance and Earth Cutting permission from the Govt. of Assam. In the 6th FRSG meeting State Govt representative proposed to provide the land in Tech city, Guwahati. Matter is being follow up with Govt. of Assam for alternate piece of land, no alternate land allotted till date. The PRSG noted that the Construction could not be started due to non-receipt of environmental clearance and permission for Earth Cutting; also, NIELIT is seeking a suitable land from Government of Assam. Hence setting up of permanent Centre at Guwahati is dropped from the present proposal.
- 7.6 At Tezu, land was identified for Construction of permanent campus of NIELIT in the year 2015. Since 2015 to 2018 matter was follow up with State Covt. for handing over of land for Construction. The land has not made available by state Government so far, therefore construction of NIELIT campus at Tesu has not taken place. CI mentioned that the NIELIT committee has recommended to drop the campus construction from the justant project. PRSG took note of the above and recommended to drop setting up of permanent campus at Tezu from the present project.
- CI mentioned that the above 6 centres are offering 22 courses from temporary built-up premises since 2012 and trained 15,261 students till 31.03.2019. These centres would keep offering training courses to the local population. The fund expenditure details of the above 6 centres is placed at Annexure-III.
- PRSG noted the above and deliberated the same in details. It emerged that the project is currently in the 8th year of implementation (actual duration 5 years) Shorker Do

therefore, PRSG recommended to drop the construction of permanent campuses of above six centres i.e. Itanagar, Tezu, Shillong, Tura, Guwahati, Silchar from the instant project and recommended that the NIELIT may submit separate fresh proposals to MeitY for Guwahati, Shillong and Silcher after getting pussession of suitable land from the respective State Governments."

- 7.9 PRSG also suggested to continue the training programs at above mentioned six centres under the ambit of NIELIT w.e.f. 01.04.2019. The required recurring and other expenditure support etc. would be met out by NIELIT for above six Centres w.c.f. 1.4.2019 and onwards from its own resources. Also, NIELIT may obtain accounts statements for above mentioned six Centres till 31.03.2019 since these Centres would not be consider under the ambit of the instant project.
- 8. CI further mentioned that 12 Campuses of NIELIT are at different stages towards successful completion. PRSG noted that following 12 Centres would be completing construction of the campus/up-gradation of the Campus. Based on details of pending works presented to PRSG; the PRSG recommended that the duration for completion of the all the pending works for individual locations as per the schedule given in the table below:

CI requested PRSG to consider release of the funds for Civil and Utilities, procurement of equipment's, recurring expenses and additional funds for Civil head due to high tender cost, construction of boundary wall, retention wall, PMC charges, GST and other essential important additional construction works. The detail of the same is given at Annexure III and IV.

10. PRSG noted the total fund requirement of Rs, 104,79 Crore to meet the cost towards civil and utility (including additional fund of Rs. 45.05 Cr. under civil head), equipment's and recurring for 12 centres/ extension centres. Funds available with NIELIT to spend Rs. 49.34 Cr. and further an amount of Rs. 55.45 Cr. could be released by MeitY. PRSG mentioned that the funds need to be utilized from fund available with NIELIT Hqr under the project, IR generated by the 18 centres and next fund releases by MeitY. It was mentioned that the balance funds(savings) under equipment and recurring heads under the individual project locations could be utilized to meet the additional cost under civil and utility head.

- Civil and Utility Balance including additional amount of Rs. 83.48 Cr.
- The equipment Expenditure towards procurement is Rs. 15.50 for 18 Centres, further required fund for 12 Centres is Rs. 12.90Cr.
- The recurring expenditure for 18 Centres is Rs. 68.03 Cr. further required for 12 Centres is Rs. 7.68 Cr.
- The PMU expenditure is Rs. 1.77 Cr., further requirement is Rs. 0.73 Cr.
- The total present fund requirement is Rs. 104.79 Cr. out of this the funds available with NIBLIT to spend is Rs.49.34 Cr; hence, next instalment of Rs. 55.45 Cr may be consider for release to NIBLIT.
- 11. CI requested PRSG to consider recurring expenses for 3 centres till they complete all pending works towards setting up of Campuses at Churachandpur (till June, 2019), Lunglei (till December, 2019) and Gangtok (till March, 2020). The PRSG noted the same. The breakup of the same is placed at Annexure III. PRSG also mentioned the Fire Fighting equipment's requirement presented could be borne by NIELIT own resources.
- 12. It was noted that the CI did not present updated information as collected by PMU for the PRSG. The matter was taken on a serious note and it was directed by the PRSG that PMU/NIELIT to take necessary precautions towards collection of various data of the individual Centres at 18 locations on regular intervals and compile the same and submit to MeitY. Non compliance of above will be viewed seriously.
- 12. After due deliberation, the PRSG recommended the following:

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- Extension of the project duration till 31.03.2020 for successful completion of construction of NIELIT campuses at 12 locations as mentioned at para 8.
- Release of Rs. 55.45 Crore to NIELIT ref. table 10.1.
- iii. Recurring expenditure is permitted for Churachandpur centre (till June, 2019), Lunglei centre (till December, 2019), Gangtok centre (till March 2020) & for Dibrugarh, Jorhat and Tezpur centres (Till 31.12.2019). For Pasighat centre (till 31st July 2019), for Chuchuyimlang centre (till 31st Oct'19) & Aizawi centre (30 June 2019. The 3 centres viz. Imphal, Kokrajhar, Senapati, recurring cost has to be met out from Centre's own resources w.e.f. 01.04.2019 and onwards.
- iv. Recommendation for individual centres as given at Annexure V.
- v. NIELIT to submit Utilization Certificate (UC) of earlier releases made by MeitY.
- vi. After possession of clear land till from respective State Governments, NIELIT may submit fresh proposals for setting up of Centres at Guwahati & Silchar. Presently setting up of permanent Centres at these location have been dropped from the project. These centres may keep offering training programmes from temporary premises with all support from own/NIELIT Hqr resources.
- vii. Though land at Shillong is in possession and initial construction work has been is stopped due to local land clearance issue, therefore NIELIT may submit fresh proposal after getting land clearance. Presently setting up of permanent Centres at this location has been dropped from the project. This centre may keep offering training programmes from temporary premises with all support from own/NIELIT Her resources.
- viii. The setting up of permanent campus at ltanagar & Tezu to be dropped from the ongoing project, since no land is available. These centres may keep offering training programmes from temporary premises with all support from own/NIELIT Hqr resources.
 - Setting up of NIELIT campus at Tura to be dropped due to non-initiation of construction activities despite best efforts.
 - x. Regarding Centres cost of equipment's for Fire fighting systems, NIELIT may bear the same for its own resources.
 - xi. Savings under Equipment and Recurring heads could be utilized to meet additional cost/expenditure towards civil and utility head for earlier reference of MeirY's letter Ref. No. L-14011/34/2014-HRD(Vol-II) dated 12.04,2016. The copy of order is given as Annexure-VI.
