I am directed to refer to this Administration's letter No. 28/69-IH(7)-2015/25321 dated 11.12.2015 on the subject noted above and to state that the Secretary, Government of India, Ministry of Communications & Information Technology, Department of Electronics and Information Technology (DeitY) vide D.O. No. 43(5)/99-NIELIT (Vol.2) dated 01.01.2016 (copy enclosed) has stated that National Institute of Electronics & Information Technology (NIELIT) has some popular courses which are also in line with making one person in every family digitally literate- an integral component of the Primé Minister's vision of 'Digital India'. Recently, a component on 'Financial Inclusion' to promote Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana has been also retrofitted in these courses for greater awareness on access to financial services. Some of the popular courses offered by the NIELIT are as under:-

Awareness in Computers Concepts (ACC)- 20 hours a)

Basic Computers Concepts (BCC)- 36 hours b)

Course on Computer Course (CCC) - 80 hours / CCC+ c)

Expert Computer Course (ECC)- 200 hours d)

To implement the policy decision already taken vide letter dated 11.12.2015 referred to above, it has been decided that ICT courses of National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT) are mandatory for all fresh recruitments and promotions of all posts in Chandigarh Administration.

You are requested to make necessary amendment in all Recruitment Rules of different service cadres (i.e. entry/promotion levels) with the approval of the competent authority at your own.

8000+ Facilitation Centres.

2. NIELIT's Digital Literacy courses have the objective of equipping an individual to acquire necessary skills and attain computer literacy, which is also in line with making one person in every family digitally literate – an integral component of the Prime Minister's vision of 'Digital India'. Some of its popular courses include:

(a) Awareness in Computers Concepts (ACC) - 20 Hours

(b) Basic Computers Concepts (BCC) - 36 Hours

(c) Course on Computer Concepts (CCC) - 80 Hours

(d) CCC+ - 126 Hours

(e) Expert Computer Course (ECC) - 200 Hours

3. Recently, a component on 'Financial Inclusion' to promote *Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana* has been also retrofitted into these courses for greater awareness on access to financial services. Also, concepts of e-Governance services and cyber security have been introduced in the CCC, CCC+ and ECC courses.

4. Further, to facilitate 'anywhere-anytime' learning and to cater to the needs of masses in remote areas, CCC contents (available in 25 Indian languages) are also offered in e-Learning mode, which can be accessed from the NIELIT portal, free of cost. To ensure quality, assessment and certification of candidates is undertaken solely by NIELIT, through an independent Online Examination System, in the proctored mode, on monthly basis.

The NIELIT CCC course is in existence for more than 10 years now and owing to the popularity of the CCC course, it has been recognized by the states of Gujarat, Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh and various Government organizations for recruitment.
