

HIGHLIGHTS

A. ORGANIZATION MANDATE

National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT), is an autonomous scientific society under the administrative control of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. NIELIT is actively engaged in Capacity Building and Skill Development in the areas of IECT, FutureSkills, Cyber Law; Cyber Security; GIS; Cloud Computing; ESDM; e-Waste; e-Governance and related verticals. It offers courses both in the Formal as well as the Nonformal sectors and is also one of the National Examination Bodies which accredits institutes/ organizations for the conduct of courses in the Non-Formal Sector. NIELIT is also rolling out IT Literacy Programmes for many State Governments for its employees and the masses.

NIELIT is functioning under the overall control and guidance of the Governing Council. The Hon'ble Union Minister for Electronics and Information Technology (E&IT) is the Chairperson of the Council whereas Hon'ble MoS (E&IT) is the Deputy Chairperson with its members from Government, Industry, Academia and representatives of various professional bodies.

The **Management Board** of NIELIT is chaired by the Secretary, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. Each NIELIT Centre has an Executive Committee consisting of representatives from respective State Governments, academic institutions and industry for the effective implementation of the decisions of the Board and the Council.

The Finance & Accounts (F&A) Committee of NIELIT is chaired by the Director General, NIELIT and the Committee assists the Governing Council by recommending the Budget Estimates / Revised Estimates and other finance related matters. The Committee is also mandated to scrutinize the Audited Annual Accounts before its submission to the Governing Council for adoption, besides appointment of Auditors. Director General NIELIT is the Chief Executive Officer of the organization. He is supported by Registrar, CFO, CoE and Joint Directors of Technical Wing at HQs and Executive Directors/Directors at Centres level.

The Academic Advisory Committee (AAC) is chaired by an eminent Academician with its members drawn from Academic and Industries and is the Advisory Body on the academic activities of NIELIT.

The Vigilance department of NIELIT is headed by the Chief Vigilance Officer (CVO), a senior officer from MeitY. The CVO is assisted by Vigilance Officers at all Centres and also at NIELIT Headquarters.

In order to promote transparency and accountability, mandatory provisions of the Right to Information Act (RTI) have been implemented in the Institute with effect from July 2005. The Public Information Officer (PIO) at Headquarters, as well as, PIOs at all NIELIT Centres have been appointed, as per the requirement spelled out under RTI Act. To deal with the requests under RTI Act, internal procedures have been formulated and the mandatory information has been hosted on the NIELIT website (www.nielit.gov.in). With a view to bring excellence in public service



delivery and to redress grievances of citizens in a meaningful manner, NIELIT has also appointed a Public Grievance Officer (PGO), in line with the guidelines promulgated by Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances.

As on date, NIELIT has pan-India presence through a network of 43 own Centres located at Agartala, Aizwal, Ajmer, Alawalpur, Aurangabad, Bhubaneshwar, Calicut, Chuchuyimlang, Churachandpur, Chennai, Delhi, Dibrugarh, Gangtok, Gorakhpur, Guwahati, Haridwar, Imphal, Itanagar, Jammu, Jorhat, Kohima, Kokrajhar, Kolkata, Kurukshetra, Lakhanpura, Leh, Lucknow, Lunglei, Majuli, Mandi, Pali, Pasighat, Patna, Ranchi, Ropar, Senapati, Shillong, Shimla, Silchar, Srinagar, Tezpur, Tezu and Tura, with its Headquarters at New Delhi. A Training Facilitation Centre is also operated at Chandigarh.

B. SKILL DEVELOPENT, CAPACITY BUILDING AND EMPLOYABILITY

The National Policy on Skill Development is aimed towards empowering all individuals through improved skills, knowledge and nationally and internationally recognized qualifications to gain access to decent employment and to ensure India's competitiveness in the global market. NIELIT plays an important role for skilling of youth in the area of IECT, especially in rural sectors. The wide repertoire of NIELIT Courses includes: (a) Courses in the Formal Sector offered by the NIELIT Centres in association with State Universities/Technical Board such as ME/ M.Tech, BE/B. Tech, MCA, BCA programmes; Aurangabad Centre is also facilitating PhD Program in the area of Electronics (b) Courses in the Non Formal Sector in IT, Hardware, etc., under four levels, namely O, A, B and C Level; (c) Short Term Courses in niche areas; and (d) IT Literacy Programmes for the proliferation of Digital Literacy in the country; besides specialized programmes in e-Governance, e-Waste, GST etc. targeted towards empowering the employees of the State Governments. In addition, NIELIT has also created expertise for the roll out of customized skill development programmes, as per specific needs of public and private sector firms.

C. SYNERGY THROUGH COLLABORATIONS AND MoUs

Joint Training Program with III, Taiwan

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for "Joint Training Program in the field of Electronics and IT" for a period of five years was signed between National Institute of Electronics and IT(NIELIT) and Institute for Information Industry (III), Taiwan in "India Taiwan Industrial Collaboration Summit" held on 17th October 2019 with the core objective to expand and enhance cooperation in training and skill development in the field of Electronics and Information Technology through the exchange of institutional experience, training and skill development.

The project has been approved vide No. W-13/4/2019-ESDM-MeitY dated 09.06.2020 with total budget outlay of Rs.3,08,92,365/- and GIA/MeitY's contribution of Rs. 1,41,59,365/-. In next 5 years, 5 training programs (one program in each year) are to be conducted.



MoU with Himachal Pradesh Kaushal Vikas Nigam, Govt of H.P.



A MoU was signed between NIELIT Shimla and Himachal Pradesh Kaushal Vikas Nigam (HPKVN) on 15th July, 2019 in the presence of Hon'ble Chief Minister, Shri Jai Ram Thakur. CAMPUSES DURING 2019-2020

With a vision to provide an excellent infrastructure with residential facilities for the benefit of the students from far flung areas, Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India has approved the setting up of permanent campuses of NIELIT Centres in different parts of the country. The new Centres have helped in expanding the NIELIT's reach to the remote areas where other institutes of good repute are not present in the areas of Electronics & Information Technology. Apart from setting up of permanent campuses, efforts are also made to set up extension Centres at remote areas under monitoring of respective NIELIT Centre at the state. In vision of PAN India presence of NIELIT, efforts are also being made with respective State Governments for soliciting support in form of rent free built up space/land.

The building projects completed/ongoing during 2019-20 are as follows:

Construction/upgradation of permanent campuses in North East: In North East, 18 campuses were approved by Hon'ble Cabinet in 2012. Centers are operational from all these 18 locations from temporary built up space. Construction of permanent campus is in progress at 9 locations (Senapati in Manipur; Lunglei in Mizoram; Chuchuyimlang in Nagaland; Pasighat in Arunachal Pradesh; Tezpur, Kokrajhar, Jorhat, Dibrugarh in Assam and Gangtok in Sikkim). Building has been handed over for 3 locations (Imphal and Churachandpur in Manipur, Aizawl in Mizoram).

Construction of Hostel Building as NIELIT Srinagar: Hon'ble Union Minister for Electronics & Information Technology and Law & Justice, Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad laid foundation stone for Construction of new Hostel Building at NIELIT Srinagar Campus on 22nd January 2020. Construction work is in progress by State PWD with budget outlay of Rs. 9.54 Cr.

E. DIGITAL LITERACY

Digital India is a campaign launched by the Government of India to ensure the Government's services are made available to citizens electronically by improved online infrastructure and by increasing Internet connectivity or by making the country digitally empowered in the field of technology. Digital Literacy refers to an individual's ability to find, evaluate, produce and communicate clear information through various digital platforms such as smart phone, laptops, Digital Literacy helps people to use technology in complementing their daily desktops etc. routine and become more productive.

NIELIT as the HRD arm of Meity, is making efforts to bridge the 'digital divide' through its IT Literacy Courses leading to employability of youth, especially for the marginalized section of the society. NIELIT has a range of Digital Literacy courses, namely Awareness in Computer Concepts (ACC – 20 Hours), Basic Computer Course (BCC – 36 Hours), Course on Computer Concept (CCC – 80 Hours), Course on Computer Concepts Plus (CCC Plus – 126 Hours), Expert Computer Course (ECC – 200 Hours) which are recommended for effective proliferation of Digital Literacy in the country and many State Governments have also recognized these courses for employment/ promotion/increment purposes. Recently, the ACC, BCC and CCC courses have been revised in line with the market demand.

To enable 24x7 learning, the e-Content of CCC course in 25 languages has been developed and made available at the website of NIELIT. As far as Classroom teaching is concerned the course is being delivered by about 10,000+ Facilitation Centres throughout the Country. Besides every month examination for the courses are being held at more than 150 Examination Centres across the country. The course is governed by a complete online system i.e. registration of candidate for examination, receipt of examination fee, conduct of examination, declaration of results and issue of digitally signed e-Certificates. On an average more than 60,000 candidates appear for online examination cycle of digital literacy courses that are conducted on monthly basis.



5th Revision of O and A Level Syllabus in IT

The need of industry is rapidly changing with the availability of new and advanced technologies



and tools leading towards change of job roles. Taking into account the recent technological disruption, NIELIT has revised the O and A Level syllabus in IT for the 5th time. The 5th revised 'O' and 'A' level syllabus are designed to enhance the skills of students at par with the industry demands as it includes courses on many emerging technologies like IoT, Artificial Intelligence, Python etc. Teaching in the 5th

revised syllabus has already started and the first exam in revised syllabus has been held in January 2021.

Before starting the teaching in new syllabus, a pool of experts from NIELIT's own manpower resources were created so that they can further train the Accerdited Institutions on need basis. In this regard, the training of Master Trainers on Internet of Things (IoT) Applications was conducted at NIELIT Calicut during 26-30, August 2019. Total 17 Officials from 13 NIELIT Centres participated in the training program. Also, the Training of Master Trainers in Python



Language was organized by NIELIT Chandigarh at Kurukshetra Centre during 9-13, September, 2019 in which 16 Officials from 11 NIELIT Centres participated.

Schemes for Skill Development in ESDM Sector

NIELIT is implementing 2 Schemes for Skill Development in ESDM Sector viz.'Scheme for Financial Assistance to select States/UTs for Skill Development in Electronics System Design and Manufacturing (ESDM) sector' (Scheme-1) and 'Skill Development in ESDM for Digital India' (Scheme-2) sponsored by MeitY. The schemes are aimed towards facilitating creation of an eco-system for development of ESDM sector through skill development of total 4,18,000 persons (90,000 for Scheme-1 and 3,28,000 for Scheme-2) Under these Schemes, skill development training in electronic sector is provided to students and unemployed youth through Training Partners affiliated to Key Implementing Agencies (KIAs) viz. ESSCI, TSSC, NIELIT, HSSC.

NIELIT is one of the KIA. To implement the project, Programme Management Unit (ESDM-PMU) is set-up by NIELIT which is working under administrative control of HRD Division, MeitY to monitor the project at ground level. So far, 3.76 Lakh candidates are enrolled, out of which 3.58 Lakh candidates have been trained, out of which 2.19 Lakh candidates are certified and 22,864 no. of candidates are placed cumulatively in both the schemes till 31st March 2020. The Scheme duration has been extended up to 31.03.2021.



Cyber Forensic Data Centre at NIELIT Kohima:



In recognition of the contribution made by NIELIT Kohima in the area of Cyber Forensics domain providing capacity building trainings with hands-on experience and forensic analysis services to the Law Enforcement Agencies of NE States, MeitY has sanctioned to setup a State of Art Digital Forensic Data Centre at NIELIT Kohima to provide forensic services Including remote forensics live acquisition and analysis of digital evidence, Virtual Training Services to NE States.

Cyber Forensic Workshop was conducted by NIELIT Agartala for Tripura Police Cyber Cell Investigating Officers at KTDS Police Training Academy, Govt of Tripura. NIELIT Agartala will act as consultant of the Cyber Forensic Lab of the Police Training Academy.







- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the society's internal control
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the society's ability to continue as going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up







to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the society to cease to continue as a going concern.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to be where on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

For Centers we did not audit and have been audited by other auditors whose reports have been furnished to us by the Management, accordingly we have relied on such auditors to carry out above mentioned additional steps.



SCHEDULE 24 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The National Institute of Electronics & Information Technology (here-in-after referred as NIELIT), an Autonomous Scientific Society (re-named with effect from 10.10.2011 from DOEACC Society) under the administrative control of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India was set up during November, 1994 to carry out Human Resource Development and related activities in the area of Information & Communications Technology (ICT). The society is registered with Income Tax Department u/s 12A and has been formed exclusively for the purpose to generate quality manpower and develop skilled professionals in the area of Information, Electronics & Communications Technology (IECT) and allied fields, by providing world class education & training and accreditation services. The Society is engaged both in the formal &Non-formal Education in the area of Information & Communications Technology (ICT) besides development of Industry oriented quality education and training in the state-of-art areas establish standards to be the Country's premier Institution for Examination and Certification in the field of ICT. It is also a National Examination Body which accredits institutes/organizations for conducting courses particularly in the Non-formal Sector of IT Education & training. NIELIT is working through its 20 centres i.e.- Aizwal, Aurangabad, Agartala, Ajmer, Calicut, Chandigarh, Chennai, Delhi, Gangtok, Gorakhpur, Guwahati, Itanagar, Imphal, Kolkata, Kohima, Patna, Ranchi, Shillong, Shimla and Srinagar & Jammu.

The following policies represent the consolidated accounting policies of NIELIT including its various centers and also include various material information and material notes to accounts specifically mentioned in various center's audited financials becoming part of this consolidated financial statements of NIELIT

ACCOUNTING CONVENTION:

Method of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention and unless otherwise stated below on the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of financial statements and the reported amount of revenues of expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/ materialize.

2. INCOME RECOGNITION

All the NIELIT Centers are following accrual method of accounting except:

- In case of Agartala Centre Income from 'ISEA Project-II and DONER Project are accounted on cash basis.
- Calicut Centre- Income from Student Projects is recognized on completion basis.
- New Delhi & Guwahati Centre recognized Grant actually received from Government of India on cash basis.
- Imphal & Srinagar/Jammu Center recognized course fees on receipt basis.



- e) Registration Fee, Accreditation Fee, Variable Accreditation Fee (VAF) and Awareness Creation Fund (ACF) have been recognized on receipt basis.
- The revenue Grant-in-Aid released by the MeitY to Centers for meeting of Recurring Expenditure 3. has been accounted as income by respective centers, as detailed below:

Investments

Funds of the Society invested in Short Term Fixed Deposits with nationalized banks have been shown as per guidelines of the Society for "Treasury Management of Surplus".

Interest on Fixed Deposit kept for Earmarked/Endowment Fund received during the year, is being credited to respective Earmarked/ Endowment Fund.

5. Inventory

In case of Aurangabad Center, it has valued and shown closing stocks of material, components, publications, consumables etc. as per the revised and modified policy of head office New Delhi. The valuation has been made on the basis of cost or net realizable value whichever is lower.

In case of Calicut Center, Store and Spares, Stock of Printing and Stationery, Lab Equipment and Course Material are physically verified during the year management and valued at least of cost and net realizable value.

In case of Chandigarh, Stocks are valued at lower of cost or net realizable value.

Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition. In respect of project involving construction, related pre- operational expenses, form part of the value of the Assets capitalized.

- a) In respect of Calicut Centre, the value of equipment's consisting of 17 numbers of items given as grant to the Centre by UNDP have been shown at a notional value of Rs.1/- on both liability and asset side.
- b) In case of Kolkata centre Fixed Assets are stated at cost (Gross) less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes \ cost of acquisition, installation, which is inclusive of freight and duty, taxes, incidental expenses. Leasehold Land for 999 years at Sector 1 of Bidhannagar (Salt Lake, Plot No. 267, Block-BF) has been shown under the head "Building" in the Fixed Asset schedule.
- In case of Chandigarh there was a major fire incident in June, 2014 in the building occupied by NIELIT Chandigarh (formerly Regional Computer Centre) at SCO 114-116, Sector 17B, Chandigarh. Appropriate accounting entries regarding losses/write-offs in respect thereof have been



recorded in the year 2015-2016. In the said incident, the Centre lost almost all the records till that date, including Fixed Asset Register.

- In respect of Agartala Centre, 15 Acres of Land for building the permanent campus has been allotted by Govt. of Tripura at free of cost, the same has been shown at the Nominal Value of Re. 1/-. under the Fixed Assets Schedule.
- e) The Government of Rajasthan has allotted 16.33 Hectares of land at Village Khoda near Kekri Distt. Ajmer for 99 years lease at free of cost has been shown at the nominal value of Re.1/-.
- In case of Guwahati center: in respect of NE Capacity Building Project of Silchar& Jorhat Extension Centre, expenditure incurred on renovation of building (Civil & Electricals) taken on rental basis for a period of 4 years has been shown as deferred expenditure to be written off over the period of occupancy. Further in respect of NIELIT Guwahati (City Centre), expenditure incurred on renovation of building (Civil & Electricals) taken on rental basis for a period of 10 years has been shown as deferred Expenditure to be written off over the period of occupancy.

7. Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on W.D.V. method as per rates specified in the Income Tax Act 1961.

Depreciation for current year on "Grant related Assets" is debited to Income & Expenditure Account and also credited to Income & Expenditure Account as per AS-12 and deducted from "Capital Grant-in-Aid" during the year.

8. **Government Grants**

During the financial year 2019-2020 NIELIT has not received GIA (Plan) and (Non Plan) from MeitY.

9. Change in Accounting Policy

During the year no such changes take place.

Employee's Benefits 10.

- Provision for Gratuity is accounted for on actuarial valuation as per AS -15. The liability of Gratuity in respect of Chandigarh has been covered by the policy obtained in favor of the respective Employee's Trust under Group Gratuity cash accumulation from LIC of India. NIELIT employees are covered under the existing Gratuity scheme as on 14.12.2002 i.e. on month emoluments (Pay + Grade Pay) for each employee, for each completed year of Service.
- Provision of Leave Encashment is accounted for on actuarial valuation basis as per AS-15.
- Bonus is accounted on Cash Basis.
- NIELIT HQ and Centers have been covered under EPF w.e.f. 01.01.2003 with the approval of the Competent Authority. EPF Contributions from April, 2013 onwards are being deposited with RPFC. The arrears of EPF for the period from 01.01.2003 to 31.03.2013 have been deposited with EPF Office. The balance lying in NIELIT CPF, is being reconciled.

NIELIT has adopted NPS Scheme for regular employees, joined after 1st September, 2014.

Other Litigations: (11)

- NIELIT Chandigarh initiated arbitration proceedings against Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) for recovery of dues amounting Rs. 15,66,021 for providing instructors for School project, appropriate provision in respect of which had already been made in the books as Provision for Doubtful Debts. KVS not has only refuted the claim of the centre but has also filed a counter claim of Rs. 2,68,650/- as over payment of the Centre (formerly RCC). Arbitration proceedings are yet to be concluded.
- ESI had issued demand notice for Rs. 11,22,702/- and Rs. 3,03,947/- for non-compliance of ESI Scheme for the period from Oct 2002 to March 2003. Dy Director, ESI vide Order No. PB.17000399790001013/245 dated 21.07.2011 has directed the Centre for payment of the demand. However, the centre has preferred an appeal and accordingly Civil Writ Petition (CWP) No. 5441 of 2013 and CWP No. 5367 of 2013 are pending with Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh, though the Hon'ble High Court has granted stay against the recovery of demand as an interim relief.
- Against the orders of Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal dated 2nd May, 2014, this Centre filed Civil Writ Petition No. 15204 of 2014 before Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court Chandigarh for recovery of balance amount of wrongly drawn HRA with penal interest amounting to Rs. 3,89,642.00 by Ms. Manjit Kaur, Ex. Data Entry Operator 'E', Proceedings in the matter are in process. The said amount of Rs. 3,89,642/- was recovered from the amount of leave encashment payable on her retirement. Ms. Manjit Kaur, Ex-Data Entry operator 'E' of this Centre has again filed O.A. No. 60/129/2018 before the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Chandigarh Bench for release of withheld amount of Rs. 3,89,642/- and proceedings are under process.

Till such time the matter is decided by Hon'ble, the said amount of Rs.3,89,642/- has been treated as Contingent liabilities.

A sum of Rs. 43,24,045/- was shown recoverable against Municipal Corporation Chandigarh against Land allotted vide letter No. MC/ESTATE/2002/4732 dated 29-01-2002 which was subsequently surrendered by the Centre. In the absence of any relief provided by Chief Administrator, Chandigarh and UT Administration, Chandigarh, writ petition was filed before the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh, which was also dismissed in default, against which, another writ petition was filed for restoration of the case. The said Writ petition was also dismissed as withdrawn with liberty to file afresh on the same cause of action. Based upon the representation sent to Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh regarding re-consideration for allotment of land at Manimajra by adjusting initial payment of Rs.43.24 lacs already released by this Centre in favour of Municipal Corporation Chandigarh and non-applicability of demand note raised towards interest on delayed payment of premium, Ground Rent and forfeiture amount of consideration money, fresh Writ Petition has been filed through Central Govt. Counsel. Notice of motion was issued to counsel for Chandigarh Administration and Municipal Corporation. The reply affidavit has been filed by the Counsel of Municipal Corporation Chandigarh on 23.09.2019 after being given last opportunity by the Hon'ble High Court.

Proceedings are under process. Appropriate provision had already been made in the books of accounts of the Centre in this regard.

Sh. V. K. Jain, Ex Director In charge, NIELIT Chandigarh along with fifteen other Ex-employees of NIELIT Chandigarh who retired after 01.01.2016 and before 29.03.2018 i.e. the date of issue of Gazette Notification by Ministry of Labour and Employment, Govt. of India vide which maximum amount of gratuity payable to an employee under "The Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972"



has been increased from Rs. 10 lacs to Rs. 20 lacs., have filed O.A. No. 60/1144/2018 before the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Principal Bench, Chandigarh for grant of revised gratuity to the applicants @ maximum of Rs. 20 lacs along with interest @ 12% p.a. from respective dates of retirements of the applicants till the actual date of realization. Reply on behalf of Respondents was filed before the Hon'ble CAT. Further Proceedings are under process.

Kolkata Centre

RCC Employees Contributory Provident Fund Trust with Income Tax recognition is maintaining PF of employees who have joined NIELIT before 01.01.2004. However, PF of employees who have joined on or after 01.01.2004 is maintained at NIELIT Head Ouarter under EPR & MP Act. 1952. The centre has received a notice on 11.07,2006 and order u/s, 7A dt. 09.07,2008 and u/s 7B dtd. 30.01.2009 from Regional EPF authority that NIELIT will cover under EPF & MP Act, 1952 from August 1982. Against the above-mentioned orders, the centre has filed an appeal to the EPF Appellate Tribunal, Delhi (appropriate authority) that our Head Quarter is covered under CPF Act. 1925 as per GoI Gazette Notification dt. 26.07.1997. However, the EPF Appellate Tribunal, Delhi has dismissed the appeal by order dated 3rd August, 2011. The Centre has there after filed on appeal with the Honourable High Court, Kolkata against the aforesaid order, on 21st March, 2012. The said appeal is still pending.

NIELIT Kolkata has paid a sum of Rs. 156,854/- under protest against demand of Rs. 6,27,413/from Employees' State Insurance Corporation West Bengal Region. The demand has been disputed by the Centre.

- ii. There is contingent liability of service tax for Rs. 9,82,620/- (Rs. 4,87,425/- for CENVAT Credit availed on common input service for which assessment is pending till Balance Sheet date and Rs. 4,95,195/- under Rule 6(3) and Rule 14 of CCR Rules, 2004 for which Appeal is pending with Service Tax Authority out of which Rs. 4,95,195/- was set aside by the Commissioner of CGST &C. Ex, Howrah Commission rate vide his order no. 219/S. Tax-11/Ko1/2018 dt. 20.03.18.
- iii. Old outstanding debtors- More follow-up is required to recover old outstanding debtors of Rs.77,81,654/- each above Rs. 50,000/- in value.

Rs. 2,50,81,223/- has been paid on account of Service Tax on self-assessment basis and booked as expenses during the current year i.e. 2019-20. However, some interest or penalty may be imposed by Service Tax Department which presently cannot be quantified.

Further, NIELIT has charged Service Tax on the services provided to Department of Higher Education, Himachal Pradesh in the earlier years when such services were exempted from Service Tax, for this amount of Service Tax paid to the Service Tax Department an appeal for the refund has been filed with the authorities.

- Services provided to Director Higher Education, Himachal Pradesh was considered as exempted ii) from GST till October, 2018 and after that GST was collected and paid to the Department of GST. So, there may be liability on account of GST for the period from April, 2018 to October, 2018.
- iii) There are certain GST payments during the F.Y. 2019-20 under its GSTIN where GST amount was less paid or paid delayed along with the late fee as calculated by GSTN but interest as prescribed under section 50(1) of GST Act, 1961 has not been paid/accrued by the centre/in the books respectively, and the amount will be paid along with tax wherever applicable as and when demanded by the Authorities as final payment on cash paid basis.
- Some interest or penalty may be imposed by the Employees' State Insurance, on account of delay iv) in employee's registration on ESIC Portal. However, interest or penalty cannot be quantified presently.

- Building is constructed at Lunglei extension Centre and at Aizawl Centre, total estimated construction cost is Rs 20,62,00,000/-out of which Rs 14,70,91,647/- has been paid till 31.03.2020.
- In case of HQs, Office space at NBCC Tower, Kidwai Nagar has been acquired for Rs.47.01 crores out of which Rs. 46.16 crores have been paid till 31st March, 2020.
- NIELIT Bhawan for housing HQ has been constructed at Dwarka, Delhi, In this regard, NIELIT has released Rs. 42.64 crore till 31th March, 2020.

3. Current Assets, Current liabilities, Provisions and Loans and Advances

In the opinion of the management, the current assets, loans and advances have been stated at the value which will be realizable in the ordinary course of business, except in the case of debtors where provision for Bad & doubtful debts provided for.

a) In case of Delhi Centre

- i) A Provision of Rs. 1,11,56,830/- for doubtful debts has been made this F.Y. in respect of sundry debtors which are outstanding for more than three years. (i.e. before 31.03.2017) which in the opinion of the management is reasonable.
- ii) A provision of Rs. 30,25,941/- has been made towards doubtful debts against recoverable of Rs. 1,12,71,327/- from Director of Education, Jhandewalan. This amount is due since 2004-05. The matter is under arbitration. An arbitrator gave an Award dated 27.12.2017 for an amount of Rs. 78,98,437/- and interest @ 8% p.a. w.e.f.23.03.2011 till the date of payment on the above amount to NIELIT by Directorate of Education. In the opinion of the management quantum of provision made is reasonable.







In case of Chandigarh Centre

i) Debtors

a) The Chandigarh Centre is having Debtors of Rs. 1126.63 Lacs, out of which Rs. 490.45 Lacs are outstanding for more than 3 years. The debtors outstanding relate to even for the Financial Year 2005-06 and before that. During the audit, it has been found that considering the amount outstanding and its period, some urgent steps for recovery/monitoring need to be taken. However, as the management is of the opinion-that debtors are either from government departments or from public sector undertakings and are recoverable, and which includes existing parties also, so assessment for provision of doubtful debts could not be made.

b) Provision of Rs. 48,58,400/- has been made during the year against doubtful debts and charged to income & expenditure account as per below mentioned details:

Works Contract Tax was deducted by Punjab state power Corporation limited (PSPCL) during the period from 2006 to June 2017 from payments made to NIELIT Chandigarh. The fact that WCT is not applicable to services rendered by NIELIT Chandigarh was conveyed several times to PSPCL through letters and during meetings. An opinion in this regard was also taken from an expert and sent to PSPCL. PSPCL was requested to pay the outstanding amount but every time the reply was received that WCT has been correctly deducted and deposited with the concerned authority. The proof of deposit in the form of challan detail was then requested to claim the refund of amount from the concerned Excise and Taxation Department and the same has been provided by PSPCL recently.

After detailed deliberations on the matter with expert in the field, it has been come to notice that refund of WCT can only be filed if the assessee is registered under VAT Act 2005. NIELIT Chandigarh was providing services only and was not registered under VAT Act. Subsequently, Punjab VAT Act, 2005 was replaced by Goods & Service Tax Act, 2017 w.e.f 01.07.2017 and WCT was not deducted by PSPCL thereafter. Further, there is no provision to set off WCT deducted in pre-GST regime against present GST liability as per existing provisions of GST.

In view of the above, the cumulative amount of Rs. 48,58,400/- deducted by PSPCL on account of WCT neither seems recoverable from the debtors nor eligible for refund from the concerned Department. Hence, A provision of Rs. 48,58,400/- has been made as a Provision for doubtful debts during the year in accordance with the concept of prudence, till that time this amount is taken up with competent authority for writing off as per appropriate Delegation of Power of NIELIT.

ii) Security with Government Departments:

The amount outstanding as on 31.03.2020 is Rs. 15.30 Lacs. It includes certain old outstanding security deposits of Rs. 4.50 Lacs made with different government departments which are due/overdue for refund/recovery. Urgent necessary steps being taken for appropriate action in this regard.

iii) Balance Confirmation/Reconciliation:

Party accounts including debtors, creditors, advance received from students and others etc. remained subject to confirmation, reconciliation necessary adjustment consequent to reconciliation. Impact thereof, consequent to the said confirmation/reconciliation, on the income/ expenditure of the current /previous year(s) and assets/ liabilities, if any, is unascertainable.





- As the Centre is working with Govt. Deptts. /Autonomous bodies, so in the opinion of the iv) management, old receivables, which are not provided for or written off, are hopeful of recovery. However, the balances remained unconfirmed as on 31st March, 2020.
- Amounts aggregating to Rs. 2,73,811.10 received during the year from debtors could not be V) credited to the appropriate debtor's account for want of relevant information. The said consolidated amount has been reduced from total debtors.
- In accordance with the Office Order No.01(08)2016-NIELIT(Civil)/Vol.VI/9311 dtd. vi) 01.01.2019, NIELIT Chandigarh has shifted its operations from C-134, PUNCOM Building, Phase VIII, Industrial Area, S.A.S. Nagar (Mohali) to Campus at Birla farms, Bada Phull, Ropar (Punjab) in April, 2019, keeping a few activities of UT Chandigarh at hired space of IETE Campus, Sector 30, Chandigarh.
- Consequent upon approval of competent authority accorded vide HQ Order No. vii) NIELIT/HQ/ADT/38/2019 dated 13.05.2019, books of accounts of NIELIT Ropar have been merged with the books of accounts of NIELIT Chandigarh w.e.f. 01.04.2019 and consolidated Final accounts have been prepared for the Financial Year 2019-2020. The previous year figures are consolidated figures of NIELIT Chandigarh & NIELIT Kurukshetra (excluding NIELIT Ropar)
- On a fateful day of 18th August, 2019, Office Building at Ropar was engulfed in floods damaging viii) Building, Hardware, Furniture & Fixtures, Electrical connections, vehicles etc. Insurance claim was lodged with the New India Assurance Co. Ltd. immediately under the insurance policies taken on reinstatement value basis. Preliminary assessment of damages has been completed by the surveyor deputed by the insurance company and all requisite inputs have been provided to him. The claim of Rs. 3.50 crores (approx), which has been lodged on the basis of assessment of reinstate value given by various OEMs in respect of destroyed/damaged assets, is under

An amount of Rs. 18,69,056.00 spent on immediate repair of electrical installations, DG sets etc. damaged in the floods, which was carried out to restore the capacity of assets to their original position, has been charged to income & expenditure account. The settlement of claim is under process and admissibility of claim is yet to be finalized by the insurance company. Therefore, no income could be booked as the amount of claim receivable is not ascertainable at this stage.

Depreciation has been charged on IT equipment & other assets which were fully destroyed in floods, upto the date of flood i.e. 18.08.2019 and these assets have been marked separately in Schedule 5(B), till the approval of their writing off is accorded by the competent authority.

Stale cheques Rs. 8,39,452/- represent cheques issued but not presented whose validity has ix) expired as at close of the year. The said amount is yet to the credited to appropriate personal/party accounts pending conclusion of procedures stipulated in this regard. Further, cheques deposited but not cleared amounting to Rs. 1,77,517/- relating to past years were under inquiry, which has been concluded but accounting entries shall be passed on receipt of relevant records from the concern centre.

In case of HQ

Delhi Development Authority has allotted a plot measuring 4277.88 sq. mtr to NIELIT at Sector 8, Dwarka, New Delhi for construction of its HQ's. Final Cost of the land is yet to be finalized by DDA.



- ii) A complaint is being filed by Shri Subodh Raj & Ramniwas Sharma in the District Consumer Dispute Redressal Forum, Jaipur. NIELIT has deposited Fixed Deposit amounting to Rs. 21,000/- in the District Forum. Now the matter is pending in the National Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission New Delhi. As per information received, next date of hearing has been fixed on 06.01.2021.
- iii) Service Tax amounting Rs. 15,49,377/- and Interest on service tax Rs. 13,72,360/- has been paid by the NIELIT (HQ) during the FY 2019-20 on ACCR Fee for the period pertaining to FY 2013-14 to FY 2015-16 and on Exam Forms pertaining to FY 2013-14 to FY 2015-16 on account of demand raised by the Service Tax Audit conducted by service tax department.
- d) In case of Shillong Centre
 - During the Financial Year 2016-17, Shillong centre had given an amount of Rs. 2,86,50,000/- to Project Management Consultant (PMC) as 'Mobilization Advance' as per agreement executed between NIELIT and PMC under the project entitled "Development of North-Eastern Region by enhancing the training/education capacity in the IECT area".

The details of mobilization advance to PMCs are given as under: -

1. Hindustan steelworks construction Ltd. (for Shillong Centre)

Rs. 2,02,00,000/-

II. National Projects Construction Corporation Ltd. (for Tura Extension Center)

Rs. 84,50,000/-

As per Minutes of the 7th PRSG Meeting dated: 25th April, 2019 held at NIELIT Imphal Centre and upon subsequent approval from MeitY, the campus construction has been dropped from the instant project for both NIELIT Shillong Centre and NIELIT Tura Extension Centre. Further, as per Minutes of 8th PRSG Meeting held on 28th February, 2020 at NIELIT Guwahati Centre, PRSG suggested NIELIT to submit fresh proposal to MeitY for setting up of NIELIT Shillong Centre after getting possession of suitable land from State Government. NIELIT Shillong Centre is already in possession of land at Umsawali, Mawdiangding, Shillong and the fresh proposal is under process of finalization and will be submitted at the earliest. The land at Tura will be returned to State Government at the earliest as the campus construction work of Tura Extension Centre has been dropped from the instant project.

- M/s HSCL has been requested vide letter no. 2686 dated 6th March 2020 to refund mobilization advance of Rs. 2,02,00,000/-. The necessary action in this regard is yet to be taken by M/s HSCL. Further Indian Bank, Russell Street branch, Kolkata has been request vide letter no. 2695 dated 24th March 2020 and also with a reminder letter no. 2717 dated 14th May 2020 to take necessary action for encashment of bank guarantee (BG) no. 00364IG160000019 in favour of NIELIT Shillong. In this regard, the necessary action for encashment of BG is yet to be taken by Indian Bank, Russell Street branch, Kolkata.
- An amount of Rs. 9,45,030/- (Rupees Nine lacs forty-five thousand thirty only) is payable to students for caution money collected from them.
- An amount of Rs. 25,270/- (Rupees twenty-five thousand two hundred seventy only) is outstanding demand as per TRACES website. The matter is being taken up to write off TDS demand.



e) In case of Aizwal

- The balance of Duty & Taxes as on 31.03.2020 worth Rs. 1,27,05,962/- shown under the head "Current Assets Loans & Advances etc." Out of this Rs. 1,07,22,252/- is relating to input tax credit arising due to Construction of NE Building Works (Aizwal & Lunglei). The matter is to be reviewed.
- During the financial year 2019-20, an amount of Rs. 11,73,89,324/- received by HQ, from MEITY, Govt. of India for ST/SC Sub-plan. There after HQ adjusted Rs. 1,50,00,000/- as the amount receivable from NIELIT, Aizawl & the net amount of Rs.10,23,89,324/- was transferred to NIELIT, Aizawl.

In case of Aurangabad Centre f)

- From the accounts it is noted that in respect to TDS Receivable accounts there are very old balances from financial year 2013-14 to 2018-19 except for F.Y. 2015-16, necessary entries are required to be passed Total amount is Rs. 86,02,682/-. Necessary action in this regard to be taken in consultation with Head office.
- From deferred revenue expenditure Rs.15 lacs are appropriated as expenditure for the financial year 2019-20.

In case of Aimer g)

- Amount of Rs.4,21,820/- shown as 'Accrued income 0 level under Current Assets were pending since F.Y 2015-16.
- Long outstanding liability of training expenses payable since 31.03.2013 on MOPR project Rs. 3,32,000/-, Rural Youth Project Rs. 4,96,800/-, Advance from others Rs. 25,550/- and BCC exam expenses payable Rs.30,300/- were not explained to us hence remained unverified by us.
- An amount of Rs. 2,25,512/- is outstanding under the head stale cheque account under current liabilities since long which requires suitable action.
- DGET exam debtors includes Rs. 3,99,660/- which is outstanding for more than 3 years. No details for the same were produced before us, hence the same remained unverified by us. An amount of Rs.5,39,948/- is shown as recoverable from Aurangabad center. It is informed to us that nothing is recoverable from that that center.
- An amount of Rs. 35,55,279/- is shown under current assets as TDS receivable, which requires suitable adjustments, as TDS is claimed by HQ.
- GST Audit for the F.Y. 2018-19 and 2019-20 is under process and not completed till date.

In case of Kohima h)

- GST TDS has not been deducted on payment of Rs.23,67,550/- paid to M/s R.K. Enterprises for supply of computer workstation.
- GST TDS has not been deducted on payment of Rs. 4,67,600/- paid to M/s. Creative interiors and suppliers for supply of computer table and chairs.

5. National Population Register (NPR)

(a) Contingent Liabilities:

(i) Arbitration Petition was filed by M/S SREI Infrastructure Finance Limited before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi at New Delhi against NIELIT for release of payment for data digitization work without deducting the cost of LRUR corrections @4.3% of the digitized rate quoted by the MSP's, as decided by the Governing Council of NIELIT in its 35'th meeting held on 26th September, 2017. The arbitrator pronounced the award on 23rd April,2020 in favour of the claimant for a sum of Rs 11,23,31,726/together with interest thereon @ 11% per annum from 04.06.2015 till date .

Under Section 34 of Arbitration & Conciliation Act 1996, Arbitration Petition have already been filed by NIELIT to obtain stay and challenge the Arbitration Award dated 23.04.2020.

In case of Chandigarh Centre

(ii) Civil Writ Petition has been filed by M/S Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd in Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court Chandigarh regarding release of outstanding payment of Rs 6,01,26,36/- in respect of data digitization work of the allotted three Zones 52, 56 & 57, payment of which was processed by NIELIT Chandigarh, but withheld as per orders of Debt Recovery Tribunal ,Vishakhapatnam. The next date of hearing in the matter is 10.11.2020.

In case of Gorakhpur

- i. NIELIT Gorakhpur is responded in the matter of arbitration between M/s. SREI Infrastructures Finance Limited and NIELIT before Hon'ble Arbitration Tribunal of sole Arbitrator Justice G.Rohini against claim of Rs. 7,24,77,407.00 which may result in payment of liability in future.
- ii. The liability towards NPR project includes amount payable to MSP's based on their bills/invoices. However, the penalties calculated/imposed against the invoices of MSP's amounting to Rs. 6,48,18,991/- (previous year Rs. 6,48,18,991/-) kept as liabilities under Schedule-8 as Liabilities toward penalty charge to MSP's as per penalty clause of term of RFP.

(b) Current Assets, Loans and Advances:

In the opinion of the management, the current assets, loans and advances have been stated at the value which will be realised in the ordinary course of business.

- (c) Department of Electronics, Information & Technology (now MeitY) vide its letter bearing No: FNo7(2)2011-EG-1 dated 05/04/2011 has entrusted the work of Demographic Data Digitisation & Biometric data collection for creating National Population Register (NPR) in respect of 17 States & 2 Union Territories. RGI vide its DO No;9/83/2010-CRD(NPR) dated 27.06.2012 has withdrawn the work of Bio-Metric data digitisation from NIELIT.
- (d) Office of the Registrar General of India had released an advance of Rs 522.24 crore to the NIELIT for execution of National Population Register Project. Total cost towards Data Digitisation (NPR Project) stands at approx. Rs 569 crore.
- (e) The work of Data digitisation has been completed. The last Digitised Data has been handed over to RGI during October, 2013. However, payment to MSP's (Managed Service Provider) could not be made earlier, because NIELIT had imposed penalty as per the terms of RFQ (Request for Quotation) against the bills submitted by MSP's, which was disputed by MSP's. Further the work of LRUR (Local Register of Usual Residents) correction was also withdrawn by RGI (Registrar General of India).

The matter relating to settlement of penalty and LRUR correction cost were taken up before the competent authority of NIELIT. The competent authority had accorded approval, as under:

- That the payments is to be released to MSP's in a transparent and accountable manner after (i) deduction of LRUR correction cost, which has been quantified @ 4.3% of the digitised rate quoted by the MSP's.
- The cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections to be returned back to RGI. (ii)
- To revise the agreement signed with MSP's on account of change in the scope of work and also (iii) terms and conditions related to payment because of withdrawal of LRUR.
- (f) In accordance with the decisions of the competent authority, the cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections have been accounted for under sub head Liabilities-LRUR (NPR) under "Current Liabilities and Provisions".
- (g) Interest amounting to Rs 304.05 Crore Earned/ Accrued on unutilised Advance has been earmarked under Liabilities and not accounted for as Interest Income in the absence of guildelines from RGI.
- (h) Separate Books of Accounts have been maintained by all the NPR participating NIELIT Centres w.e.f 01.04.2012 in respect of NPR Project & prepared separate Annual Account from the FY 2012-2013.
- (i) Major fire broke out during June 2014 in the office building occupied by NIELIT Centre Chandigarh at SCO 114-116 Sector 17B, Chandigarh. Appropriate accounting entries regarding loss/write-off in respect thereof have been recorded in the FY 2015-2016. Due to fire, Centre lost all the infrastructures including NPR records/assets.
- (j) In April, 2019, NIELIT Centre Chandigarh had shifted its operation from Mohali to its own Campus at Birla Farms, Bada Phull Ropar (Punjab). On the fateful day of 18th August, 2019 Office Building was engulfed in Floods damaging Assets. However, no fixed Assets of NPR Project was damaged in the flood.
- 6. We hereby confirm that the society is not having any amount payable to any party covered under micro, small & medium enterprises as defined in section 7(1) of the micro small & medium enterprises Act, 2006, to the extent such parties identified on the basis of information collected by the management.
- 7. Debtors & Creditors, loans and advances, current assets and current liabilities are stated in the books at the value which is recoverable/ payable. However, the confirmations from the parties are under process.
- 8. Figures have rounded off to the nearest Rupee.
- 9. Previous Year Figures have been regrouped/re-classified, wherever necessary to make it comparable from the parties are under process.
- 10 During consolidation of various centres, heading/groups has been re-arranged for better and fair presentation.
- 11. Only material notes as per the understanding of the management in relation to various centre's audited financial statements have been presented in these consolidated financial statements, for non-material notes a reference can be made to individual centre audited financial statements.
- 12. NIELIT is in the process of reconciliation of its tax deducted at source with the form 26 AS issued by income tax department for the year ended 31st March, 2020.
