MINUTES OF THE 21th MEETING OF NATIONAL SKILLS QUALIFICATIONS COMMITTEE (NSQC) OF NCVET HELD ON 28th JULY 2022

- 1. The **21**st meeting of the National Skills Qualifications Committee (NSQC) under National Council for Vocational Education and Training (NCVET) was held on 28th June 2022, through Videoconferencing, under the Chairpersonship of Dr. Nirmaljeet Singh Kalsi, Chairperson, NCVET. The list of participants is at **Annexure- I.**
- 2. The decisions taken by the Committee w.r.t agenda items, in the meeting are given in the succeeding paras.

AGENDA ITEM 01: CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE 20^{TH} MEETING OF NSQC HELD ON 30^{TH} JUNE 2022

3. The Committee **confirmed** the minutes of the 20th meeting of NSQC held on 30th June 2022.

AGENDA ITEM 02: ACTION TAKEN REPORT ON DECISIONS TAKEN IN THE 20^{TH} NSQC MEETING

4. The Committee was given a detailed account of the action taken on the Minutes of the 20th NSQC meetings. The committee took note of the action taken and approved the same. The status of compliance is at **Annexure II.**

AGENDA ITEM 03: SUBMISSION OF QUALIFICATIONS FOR NSQF ALIGNMENT

5. The Committee was given an account of 51 qualifications received till 31st May 2022 for NSQF alignment and approval. Of these 51 qualifications, 48 qualifications (23 New and 25 Revised) were considered for placing in the 21st NSQC Meeting. The remaining qualifications could not be considered due to non-submission of complete documents. The decision of the committee on the 48 qualifications is given in succeeding paras. The status of approval of each qualification is at **Annexure III.**

Awarding Bodies' Qualifications

- 6. **DGT:** Four (04) new qualifications submitted by DGT were presented before the committee and approved.
- 7. **NIELIT, (MEITY):** Seven (07) revised qualifications were presented before the Committee. The Committee accorded approval to the qualifications with following changes which were agreed to by the representatives of NIELET. The details are given below:

- 8. **Automotive SSC (ASDC):** Eight (08) new qualifications presented before the Committee were approved. Further, the committee also advised the ASDC to develop short duration/ upskilling courses which could be introduced for 3rd and 4th year B. Tech./ B.E. students and align them to NSQF in the forthcoming NSQCs.
- 9. **Healthcare SSC (HSSC)**: Thirteen (13) qualifications (03 new and 10 revised) qualifications were presented before the Committee and **approved**. The entry requirement criteria should be revised for Dy. Duty Manager (PRS) and Duty Manager (PRS) Qualifications as per the new approved NSQF Level norms. Lateral entry shall be included wherever applicable.
- 10. **Life Sciences SSC (LSSSDC):** Four revised qualifications of LSSSDC presented before the Committee were **approved.**

- 11. **Hydrocarbon SSC**: One (01) new qualification presented before the Committee was approved.
- 12. **Management SSC (MEPSC)**: Four (04) new qualifications presented before the Committee were **approved** with suggested changes which were agreed to by the representative of MEPSC. The details are given below:

The committee also recommended that DoSEL/PSSCIVE may consider implementing the qualification "Career and Education Counsellor" in the schools for the teachers/trainers.

13. NASSCOM:

- 13.1 Four (04) revised qualifications presented before the Committee were **approved**. However, Committee advised NASSCOM to consider renaming the qualification "Penetration Tester" to "Software Vulnerability/ Penetration Tester" to broaden the scope of the qualification; and to include 'graduation in relevant field with two years' experience' in the entry level criteria for two qualifications "Software Vulnerability/Penetration tester" and "Cloud Architect" which was agreed by NASSCOM.
- 13.2 NASSCOM was also advised to develop six months' apprenticeship program in the two qualifications "Software Vulnerability/Penetration Tester" and "Cloud Architect" for graduating students.
- 14.**Pwd SSC (SCPwD):** Three (03) new qualifications presented before the committee were approved.

AGENDA ITEM 04: MONITORING & SUPERVISION PROCESS OF AWARDING BODIES

15. The Committee was informed that the NCVET notification no. SD-17/113/2017-E&PW mandates establishing a dynamic and robust monitoring mechanism to ensure the standards of quality and reliability in training and assessment of NSQF aligned and approved qualifications.

Further, as per para 4.3. of the Guidelines under Continuation Criteria, a recognized AB has to ensure strong and effective data management system with respect to, inter-alia, the qualifications for which the training is being conducted.

- 15.1 Hence, NSQC desired that all the recognized Awarding Bodies (ABs) shall share the details of the training centers affiliated, trainings conducted including data on assessments and placement, with respect to each NSQF aligned and approved qualification through various Govt./ fee-based schemes, on a quarterly basis for effective monitoring of the Qualification by NSQC/NCVET. The first report for the quarter ending June 2022 is to be submitted to NCVET by 16 August 2022. The template for the same is at Annexure IV.
- **15.2** The Committee took note of the same and further directed that the data for the quarter ending September 2022 be submitted by 31st October 2022 and subsequently one month after the end of each quarter as per the standard template provided by the NCVET.
- **15.3** The Committee also directed that the present cycle of the data collection will take place in physical mode and subsequently from the next cycle, NCVET will create provisions to collect this data through online mode. The awarding bodies would get the "username" and "password" of the NCVET online portal where they can provide required data.
- **15.4** Sh. Atul Kr. Tiwari, Special Secretary, MSDE emphasized to also introduce the outcome indicators into the monitoring and supervision templates. The committee took note of the suggestion and informed the participants that NCVET has prepared both the input and outcome indicators but had not shared the same. It was decided that NCVET will share both the indicators with all the stakeholders accordingly.

ANY OTHER POINT WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE CHAIR

- 16. The Chairperson, NSQC sharing his concern on the futuristic qualifications presented in various NSQC meetings mentioned that a number of future qualifications approved earlier need to be re-aligned with the revised standardised NSQF norms with respect to the entry level criteria, notional hours, NSQF levels etc. Therefore, it was decided to look into all such qualifications under various sectors, get them revised as per the new NSQF norms and obtain approval on file at the earliest.
- 17. Mr. PP Gupta, Director, DoSEL informed the committee that school has undertaken training in certain qualifications which are at level 2.5 or 3.5. If the children desire to progress their career in such qualifications they need to be given hand holding for undertaking OJT to enable them to complete their certification at level 3 or 4 respectively in that particular NSQF aligned and approved qualification. Since presently there is no SOP for enabling this, hence he requested the committee to provide common guidelines for the conduct of OJT for such candidates.

The Committee took note of the same and decided that NCVET will prepare standard Guidelines which would be applicable for the candidates being trained on various qualifications at school level.


